The post holder will be based at HMRC premises, and will be required to travel to HMRC offices, and on occasion abroad.

In your role, you'll be required to analyse evidence and review files engaging with HMRC, the police and other agencies, including investigators and prosecutors from foreign jurisdictions. Apply specific legislation, and procedures and processes, which may include European Arrest Warrant, Mutual Legal Assistance and extradition, to provide accurate advice and make sound case decisions. Therefore it is essential you are able to make effective decisions and provide clear case management strategies. You will need to be able to demonstrate a high level of oral and written communication skills and engage with senior leaders across CPS and other criminal justice partners and Government Departments.

You will have opportunities to develop your career further including using your Individual Learning Account (ILA) to attend training courses and get the chance to shadow colleagues in order to gain different perspectives. You will be supported in your progression with access to various promotion opportunities.
